In 1861, America was divided against itself, Germany was a collection of independent states, and Russia was mired in a medieval economy and aristocracy. By 1871, each had become a powerful nation on the way to becoming the superpowers that would dominate the 20th century. With the sweep of a Tolstoyan novel and the cinematic excitement of a Hollywood epic, Michael Knox Beran tells the story of the 1860s, when Lincoln freed the slaves and saved the union, Alexander emancipated Russia's serfs, and Bismarck created a united Germany that brought prosperity to millions yet awakened a taste for blood. If they succeeded, Andrews and his raiders could have changed the course of the war. Based on eyewitness accounts, as well as correspondence, diaries, military records, newspaper reports, deposition testimony, and other primary sources, Bonds has produced a blend of meticulous research and compelling narrative of the event that produced the first Medals of Honor.
