This hard-to-find series produced some of the finest biographies of political heavyweights of the latter 19th century. The first two volumes of J.G. Randall's *Lincoln the President* are also technically part of this series, but were not published in the distinct red cloth like the rest of the above; otherwise complete. Dunbar, Seymour. **A HISTORY OF TRAVEL IN AMERICA....** Indianapolis: 1915. Ltd. ed. of 250 sets on large paper, fts., illus., col. plates, maps. [Howes D-557] A fascinating survey of the modes of travel and the transportation networks which evolved from Colonial days through the close of the Frontier. From the Boston post-road through the Oregon Trail, by way of Mark Twain's Horseshoe Bend and Steamboat Landing. A charming set, and highly informative. Greely, Adolphus W. **THREE YEARS OF ARCTIC SERVICE: AN ACCOUNT OF THE LADY FRANKLIN BAY EXPEDITION OF 1881-84 AND THE ATTAINMENT OF THE FARTHEST NORTH.** New York: 1886. 1st ed., 2 vols. (428p.; 444p.), fts., illus., plates, maps, fold. maps, fold maps w/ rear pocket. The author fought with the 19th MA INF during the Civil War, saw action at Ball's Bluff, during the Peninsula Campaign, and at Antietam and Fredericksburg, and stayed in the Regular Army after the war. Detailed for service as a Signal Corps officer, Greely earned a reputation as a "trouble-shooter" on military telegraph lines on the frontier, while becoming intrigued by the Corps' Weather Bureau. This new interest led him to volunteer to lead an expedition to establish a station to study Arctic weather and climate opposite the western coast of Greenland. Greely's narrative reveals that the title adventure, while a scientific success, also had elements of Scott's and Shackelton's polar excursions. [Howes S-243(aa)] Printed on the American occupying army's own field press, this scarce reference source lists the participating officers by regiment, their location at the beginning and end of the campaign, and pertinent remarks. Among those listed are Robert E. Lee of the Engineer Corps ("wounded at Chapultepec on the 13th of September"), 1st Lt. U.S. Grant of the Fourth Infantry, and Brig. Gen. F. Pierce, commanding his own brigade in the 3rd Division. A quite scarce piece of Americana, and an important military reference. . [Howes T-149] A remarkable historical source, with a vivid portrayal of the Continental Army and its senior commanders, by an officer who served through the entire war. Thacher was a regimental surgeon with the 6th and 16th Massachusetts Continentals, observed with interest the work of British surgeons at Saratoga, and took part in the Yorktown campaign. Included are the travel journals of Brackenridge, Bradbury, Bullock, Croghan, Cuming, De Smet, Evans, Farnhaum, Faux, Flagg, Flint, Flower, Franchere, Gregg, Harris, Hulme, James, Long, Maximilian, Michaux, Morris, Nuttall, Ogden, Pattie, Ross, Townsend, Welby, Wood, and Wyeth, among others..
