(California) Orton, Richard H. **RECORDS OF CALIFORNIA MEN IN THE WAR OF THE REBELLION, 1861 TO 1867. Sacramento: 1890. 1<sup>st</sup> ed., 887p. [D130]** Histories of all the California units, with rosters of officers and enlisted men. Quite scarce! Ex-lib., but w/ no ext. markings; lt. fray. extems.; lt. soil. (esp. rear) & scuff. bds.; yellow eps.; else v.g. \$450.00

(Florida) Dickison, Mary E. **DICKISON AND HIS MEN: REMINISCENCES OF THE WAR IN FLORIDA. Louisville: 1890. 1<sup>st</sup> ed., 266p., ft., illus. [D189, Howes D-335, ITC #42]** Haphazardly organized, but with excellent information on unknown campaigns in Florida. Probably co-authored by the subject, and quite rare in first edition. Handsomely rebound in ¾ lea., faux raised sp., marbled bds. & eps., & t.e.g.; very lt. ch. extems.; else excellent. \$650.00

(Georgia) Nisbet, James C. **FOUR YEARS ON THE FIRING LINE... Chattanooga: 1914. 1<sup>st</sup> ed., 445p., ft. [D278, Howes N-159, ITC #133, Eicher #296]** Nisbet was a Georgia farmer who rose to command a regiment. His excellent and personal memoirs cover action in major battles in both theaters. Since he campaigned under General Lee as well as in the Atlanta Campaign, his accounts serve as a common resource for all modern literature on such battles as Antietam, Chickamauga, and Atlanta. (Illinois) Swan, James B. **CHICAGO'S IRISH LEGION: THE 90<sup>TH</sup> ILLINOIS VOLUNTEERS IN THE CIVIL WAR. Carbondale: (2009). 1<sup>st</sup> ed., 306p., ft., illus., maps.** This sweeping new history of an Irish regiment and its pivotal role in the Western Theater draws heavily from primary sources, giving readers an intimate glimpse into the trials and triumphs of ethnic soldiers from the regiments inception to the Grand Review. "Not as famous as other units, the Irish Legion saw hard action at Missionary Ridge and the Atlanta Campaign, and marched with General William T. Sherman to the sea and the Carolinas. James B. Swan clearly and crisply recounts their memorable story, giving readers a fresh look at the Civil War in the west, and at the immigrant soldier experience." --- Lesley J. Gordon. Wendell, NC: 1982. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed., 5 vols., fts., plates, fold. maps.** Douglas Southall Freeman called this one of the indispensable works for the study of the Army of Northern Virginia. [D56, Howes P-369]** Unusual experiences with many authenticated facts and much color. Pike had been a Texas ranger, fought Indians, and scouted in Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia, and the Carolinas under Rosecrans, Sheridan, Thomas, Crook, Sherman, and others.
